ABOUT MAYA

MAYA is a non-profit, student-run organisation that aims to raise awareness about child sexual violence. By breaking barriers and raising awareness about **sexual violence**, we work to empower every child to recognise and report it. We have collaborated with over **2000** students across **30+** schools, colleges, orphanages and residences and educated them about sexual harassment, online abuse and how to tackle it. To make mental health more accessible, we have also spearheaded a **free therapy program**, providing responsible and accurate mental health resources.





ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

PROJECT SURAKSHA

This project was a top-5 nominee (out of 30+) for Rotaract's Outstanding Project by A District!

In the month of February, MAYA, in collaboration with the Rotaract District Organisation 3191, conducted sessions on safe and unsafe touch, consent, respect and boundaries in more than 10 schools and interacted with around 800 students. The sessions aimed to equip the students with the knowledge to recognise and report unsafe touch as well as to navigate our guide on child sexual abuse.

FREE THERAPY PROGRAMME

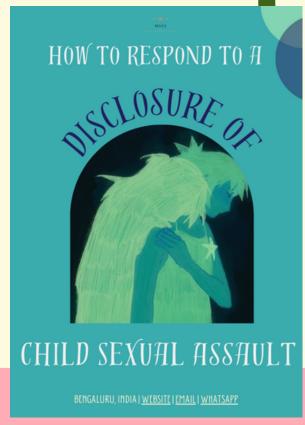
At MAYA, we firmly believe that access to emotional healing and self-understanding should not be a luxury. Every survivor deserves a holistic well-being and a chance at recovering from their trauma through the right resources. In line with this vision, MAYA had been consistently offering free therapy sessions to underprivileged students for over a year now. We have facilitated **75+** sessions.

We are now customising this program for survivors of any form of sexual violence.

GUIDE ON RESPONDING TO A DISCLOSURE OF SEXUAL ASSAULT

Responding to a disclosure of sexual assault requires the right words, empathy and a sense of responsibility. Understanding the weight such a moment carries, MAYA has developed a comprehensive guide to help individuals in responding to a disclosure of sexual assault appropriately, do's and don'ts, how to navigate the next steps and addresses other questions surrounding disclosures.

WORKBOOK

The workbook curated by the team of MAYA is designed for children in the age group of 7-14 years. It includes a range of interesting age-appropriate activities, quizzes and engaging stories. The primary objective is to educate the children on differentiating between safe and unsafe touch. The workbook has been checked and vetted by many prominent people in the field of child safety.

AWARENESS SESSIONS CONDUCTED IN BANGALORE AND JAMMU

MAYA conducted an awareness session on safe and unsafe touch in the Nagrota Military Station in Jammu. These sessions focused mainly on consent and boundaries, along with online sexual harassment. Through case studies and interactive discussions, students were sensitised to the dangers of catfishing and blackmailing.



ISSUE IN SPOTLIGHT

School-based gender related violence (SBGRV)

What is it?

- It is an act (or threat of) sexual, physical or psychological violence occurring in an educational setting. It is enabled by power dynamics and influenced by gender norms.
- It has devastating impacts such as severe psychological and physical trauma, unwanted pregnancies, sexually transmitted diseases (STI's), depression and child marriage.

Whom does it affect?

It affects girls, boys, LGBTQIA+ students and those with disabilities.



What is the most effective approach to prevent SRGBV?

The Whole-School Approach is most effective in dealing with SRGBV. It involves students, teachers, staff and community members. The battle is not of students alone!

What must be taught to prevent SRGBV?

- Students should be taught about safe and unsafe touch, consent, boundaries, reporting of abuse and building healthy relationships with their peers.
- Educators must follow the 4R's, i.e **Recognise**, **Record**, **Report and Refer**, in case of any instances of sexual abuse.
- Schools should implement clear codes of conduct with **zero tolerance** for SRGBV, and formulate anti-harassment policies.

What is the way forward?

- Speak up and Report abuse, harassment or inappropriate behaviour to a trusted adult, professional or a school official.
- Seek support from trusted sources like friends, family or counsellors for emotional strength and guidance
- Challenge problematic behaviour and comments whenever encountered to break the cycle of silence
- Understand the issue deeply through reading, dialogue, and listening to experiences
- **Spread awareness** via discussions, workshops, social media, and daily conversations.

How has MAYA worked toward the prevention of SGBRV?

- We have been conducting awareness sessions on bodily autonomy, consent, boundaries and reporting of abuse across 30+ schools, colleges and residential apartments in India. We have reached more than 2000 children and caregivers.
- We have also promoted age-appropriated education on safe and unsafe touch.

It is really encouraging to know that we have been working in line with UN Recommendations to end sexual violence!

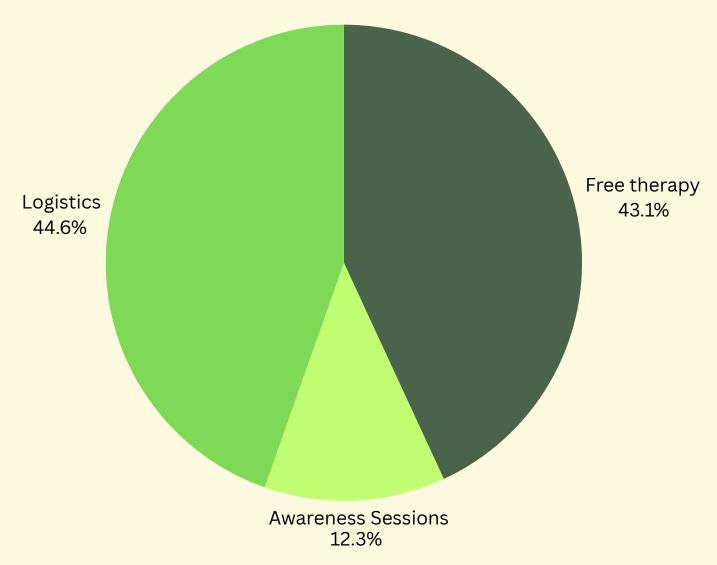

MAYA is designing a child-friendly workbook, filled with activities, stories and quizzes. This resource was curated keeping in mind 7-14 year olds, ensuring that they can engage with the workbook. It will help them recognise the difference between safe and unsafe situations.



As of March 2023, we also offer a free therapy program for those who cannot otherwise access it. We work with a team of qualified therapists, who practice a code of conduct rooted in integrity and trust.

Going further, we hope to expand our impact and improve more young lives. We are now focusing our freetherapy program for survivors of sexual violence.
